<p>7. Update on the PhD courses and events planned in 2021 The suggested date for the spring lunch coincides with the last day of “klimatfestivalen”. The CRS Advisory Group delegated the decision about fixing the date for the summer lunch to the study coordinators after they discuss it with Annika Granebeck.</p> <p>The CRS Advisory Group recommended the study coordinators to discuss with the SRC the possibility to organize a summer course with focus on science communication. If that is not possible the study coordinators should make sure to have at least a regular course on science communication during the spring 2021 and the theme of the summer course should be something different. Regarding the proposed Machine learning course, the study coordinators will evaluate what PhD students specific interests are, since ML is used for a wide range of things.</p> <p>The course Managing the Anthropocene was followed by 9 students in the autumn this year and it is planned to be offered again in the autumn 2021. From 2022 the course may be offered as a part of the MSc program in Climate Science which is currently under development. In that case, administrative hurdles to registering SU PhD students on SU Masters courses are needed to be resolved. The Bolin Centre can be a good platform to reach bilateral agreements between master courses at different departments. Alasdair tasked himself to take this suggestion to the Bolin Centre Board.</p> <p>The Advisory Group requested to the study coordinators to have a more complete version of the PhD courses and events planned in 2021 for the next meeting in January.</p> <p>Alasdair informed that within the European Alliance Civis and the hub on “Climate, environment and energy” there is the possibility for the PhD students to attend workshops and summer schools within the subject of Solid Earth Dynamic.</p>	CP/OH
