Swedish Climate Symposium, 16-18th of May

Together with SMHI, BECC and MERGE, the Bolin Centre organized the inaugural Swedish Climate Symposium conference in Norrköping, 16-18th of May. Around 600 people attended the conference in total, with ca. 300 physical participants

each day. The conference opened with plenary sessions highlighting the main conclusions of the recent IPCC 6th assessment report followed by a series of topical parallel sessions covering all aspects of climate science. The third day focused on communication of climate science to media and the general public, as well as an event for PhD students co-organized by the Bolin Centre Climate Research School. We wish to thank everyone that helped organize the conference and those of you who attended and presented!
